g. Organiser rep

- i. Concern was expressed that the organiser rep was not involved in the decision to dbl points at BW.
- ii. It was clarified that this discussion took place as an addition to a CARS BOD only meeting and was actioned at that time without the participation.

h. Competitor Rep

- i. Was looking for some further clarity on FIA cars specifically \$2000
- ii. It was pointed out that the S2000 class is not current and would likely not be specified in the class updates but that O2WD rules would potentially need to be referenced in order to determine eligibility of an FIA S2000 vehicle.

Case in point – announcement of Terry Epp's retirement was in the same email as the information regarding the double points being awarded to Big White for the CRC championship. Some people missed the notification because of this.

5. Old Business -

- a. Sponsorship money Final payment of \$5000 from Enercare has been received
- b. Regional Rally Director Warren Haywood was the only candidate put forward however discussion needed regarding a late nomination.

Motion put forward that in the light of a new candidate coming forward the nomination deadline should be extended to November 12 Loveridge/Haywood

It was discussed that the deadline with CARS is Dec 14 so the whole process must be completed by then.

Deadline for candidate nominations was extended until Nov 12.

Kelly to send out updated information to Club reps regarding the extension. On Nov 12 the list of nominees will be sent to Clubs to have their members vote on

their preferred candidates. Clubs will then have until Dec 12 to return their result. The final Club nominated candidate will then be sent to CARS by Dec 13

- c. RSO Calendar ORRC is all set. Discussions will have to be had regarding the clash of KWRC Banquet on Jan 21 and the January Jaunt event
- d. Rallycross Championship
 - i. Martin L : RallyCross championship. We had a meeting with all the rallycross organizers (PMSC, MCO, MLRC & KWRC) and agreed to have an overlay championship for 2023. A person can count their best five events with a maximum of two events counting from any one club. Event organization, classes, fees and other details are at the discretion of the individual organizers. There are no fees for competitors or clubs, we'll find some sponsorship to pay for end of the year awards. We'll keep it simple this year, perhaps add more in 2024, perhaps a club award like the ORRC does.

6. Navigational Rally Report - Louis

- a. Presidents Prize rally Oct 22 9 entries (3 expert, 6 Novice). No one got lost. Gentler instructions

They haven't announced the details yet. The event won't be included in the PMSC championship.

12. New Business

a. Pines grading bill & RSO road damage fund/fees. Ross received an invoice from the grading company for \$14,700 for Pines road preparation (Egan Creek). The grader had indicated originally that he had an allowance from MNR & was happy to apply some of that to help with the total. However, it doesn't look like he did that. As they are logging through there this winter the grader actually went above and beyond what we'd asked for but they said the logging company would be paying towards it as well.

Ross would like to challenge this & RSO agreed to that.

Ross and Bruce are looking at alternative providers for the large concrete barriers used at Detlor crossing as the grading company usually provide those. Kelly may have a contact for large round bales if all else fails – RW to contact if he needs it.

Brandon asked whether these roads would be a possibility for a future regional event if we are paying for these upgrades – it could be a possibility.

Going forward the RSO Exec will have to discuss how we handle road damages in the future; getting quotes ahead of time (has been difficult in the past); perhaps create a 'not to exceed' cost rule.

b. 2022 RSO AGM date— Kelly away all of March. Scheduled for April 22 2023. It will be a virtual AGM similar to the last couple of years. Kelly to have all notifications and paperwork ready to send out at start of March before going on vacation
