2024 Ontario RallyCross Championship (ORXC) Updated April 15, 2024 with permanent car numbers



1.0 Purpose and vision

Rallycross events in Ontario are organized by member clubs of RallySport Ontario (RSO) in accordance with CARS rules and are covered by CARS insurance. The purpose of the championship is to combine individual results from select events to determine the provincial standings. Individual clubs set up and run their own events in ways that best suit them.

The championship was established to recognize exceptional drivers and promote competition between clubs.

2.0 Eligibility of events

Clubs will submit a list of events to RSO, as early in the year as practical, that they want to include in the championship. Clubs will make their best efforts to run the listed events but weather and other factors may affect the total number of events run in a season.

RSO may charge a listing fee in the future but for 2024 there is none.

3.0 Eligibility of entrants

- 3.1 Competitors will sign up for the championship by filling in an online form.
 - 3.1.1 An annual fee for entering the championship will be set by RSO. For 2024 there is no fee.
 - 3.1.2 People entering the championship must be members of an RSO club.
- 3.1.3 Scores from events are only counted after the date the competitor registers for the championship. There are no retroactive points.
 - 3.1.4 Competitors can only score points once per event; if a single competitor had two

entries for one event then only the highest score would count.

4.0 Event Entries

Competitors are responsible for entering events they want to run. There are no reserved spots for the championship. It is the competitor's responsibility to enter early enough that there are still places available.

5.0 Classes

Clubs are free to designate classes as they wish. For the ORXC all cars will be assigned to one of the following classes:

- Two Wheel Drive (2wd)
- Four Wheel Drive Naturally Aspirated (4wdN)
- Four Wheel Drive Forced Induction (4wdF)
- Side-by Side (SxS)

6.0 Scoring

Scoring is an overlay of the final results from any eligible event. RSO will maintain the scoring spreadsheet.

- 6.1 Scores assigned for first through tenth place in class will be 20 15 12 10 8 6 4 3 2 1 plus a single point for starting an event.
- 6.2 Scores are based on the finishing position in class at an event. For example, if you come second in class, you get 15 points even if the person in first place is not registered in the championship.
- 6.3 RSO will determine at the start of the season how many events are eligible for the championship. For 2024 the best five events count with no more than two events eligible from each club.
- 6.4 RSO may adjust the number of events counting within a year if all scheduled events are not run.

7.0 Awards

Year end awards will be presented to the top three competitors in each class or 50% of the entries in each class, whichever is less.

An overall winner will also be awarded based on the total number of points on all championship events that a competitor entered. The points will be totaled regardless of the classes entered. I.E. some events in 4wdN, some in 2wd.

A club award will be presented to the club whose members accumulate the most points in the championship.

Ties will not be broken.

8.0 Car Numbers (Updated April 15, 2024) Permanent car numbers are being implemented for 2024 on a province wide basis.

At the request of competitors, we are allowing permanent car numbers.

The scoring system is easiest for the workers if cars are numbered sequentially from #1, but we recognize that permanent numbers would add to the credibility of the sport. Even with a permanent number, an event will issue a sequence number as a reminder of a competitor's position in the running order.
